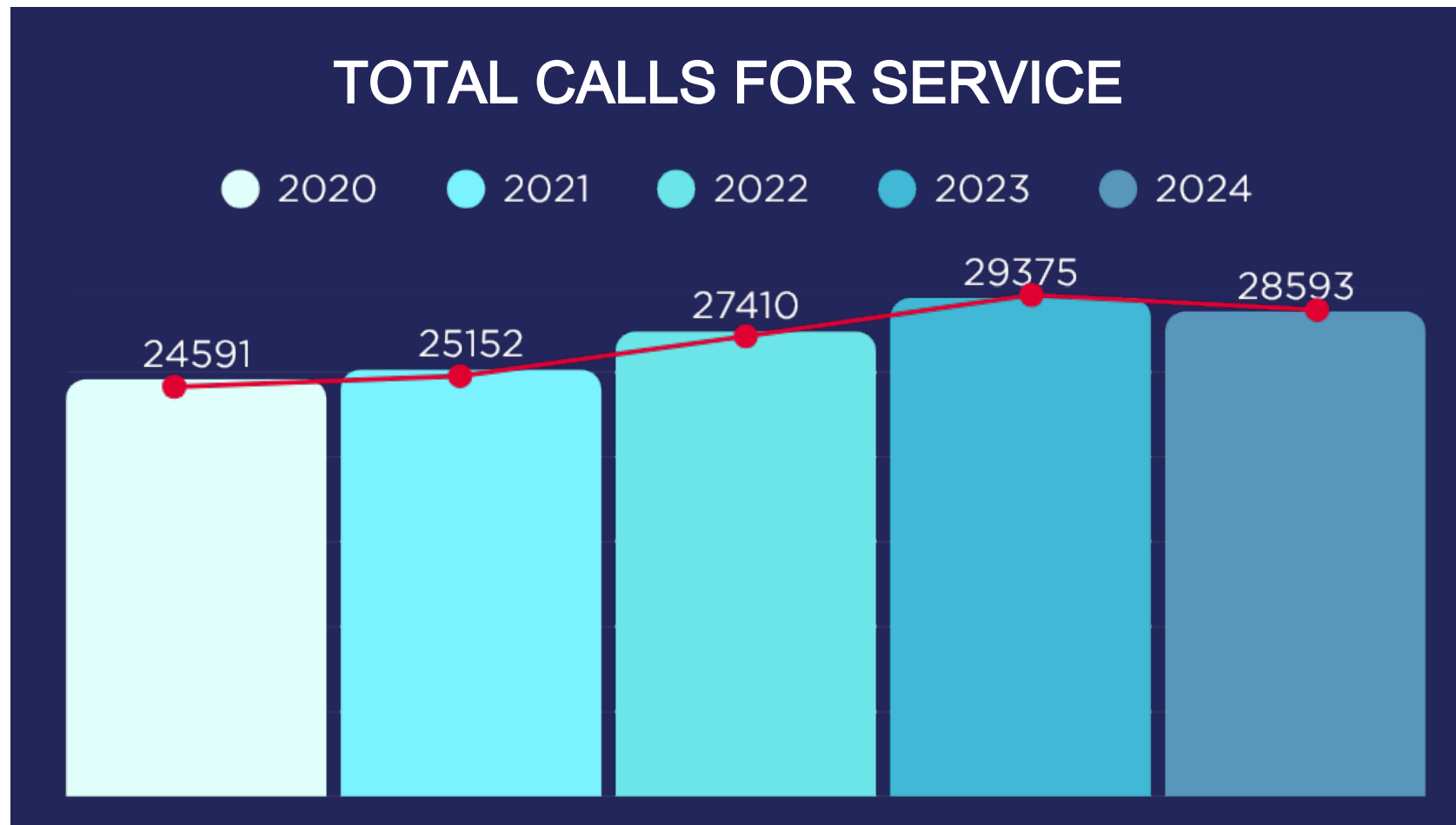

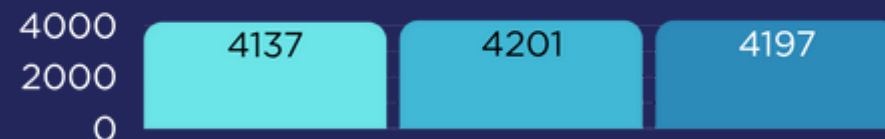

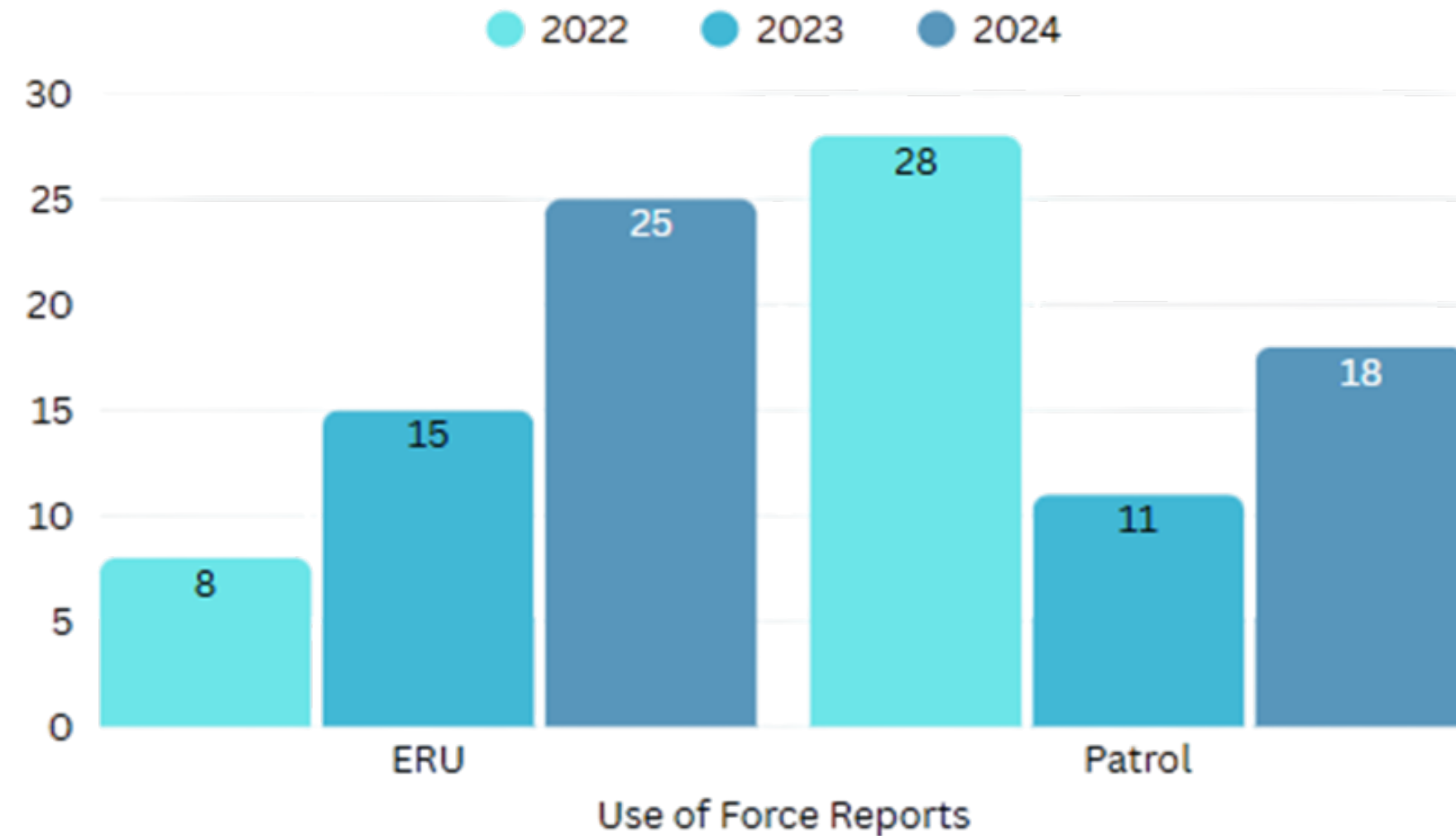

- In 2024, there were **28,826** calls for service and **over 2000** traffic stops . Officers used force in only **0.14%** of all interactions.
- 51% of all Use of Force incidents were from the Emergency Response Unit and were during the execution of search warrants.

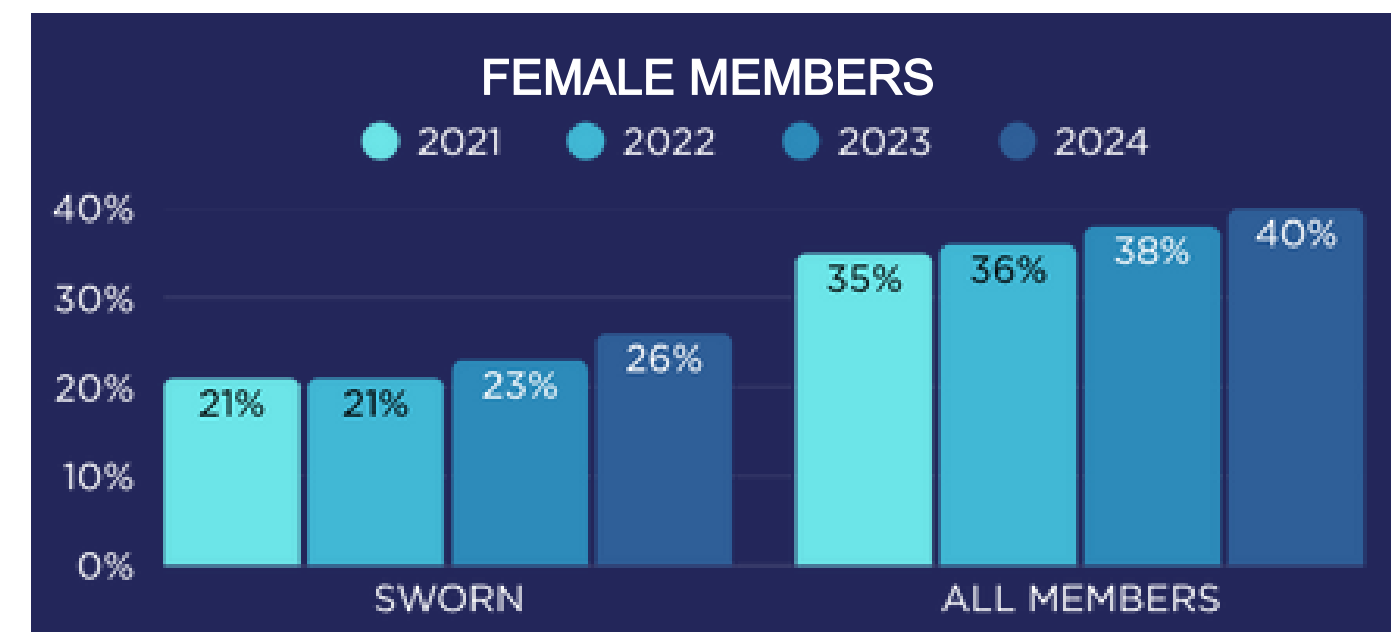
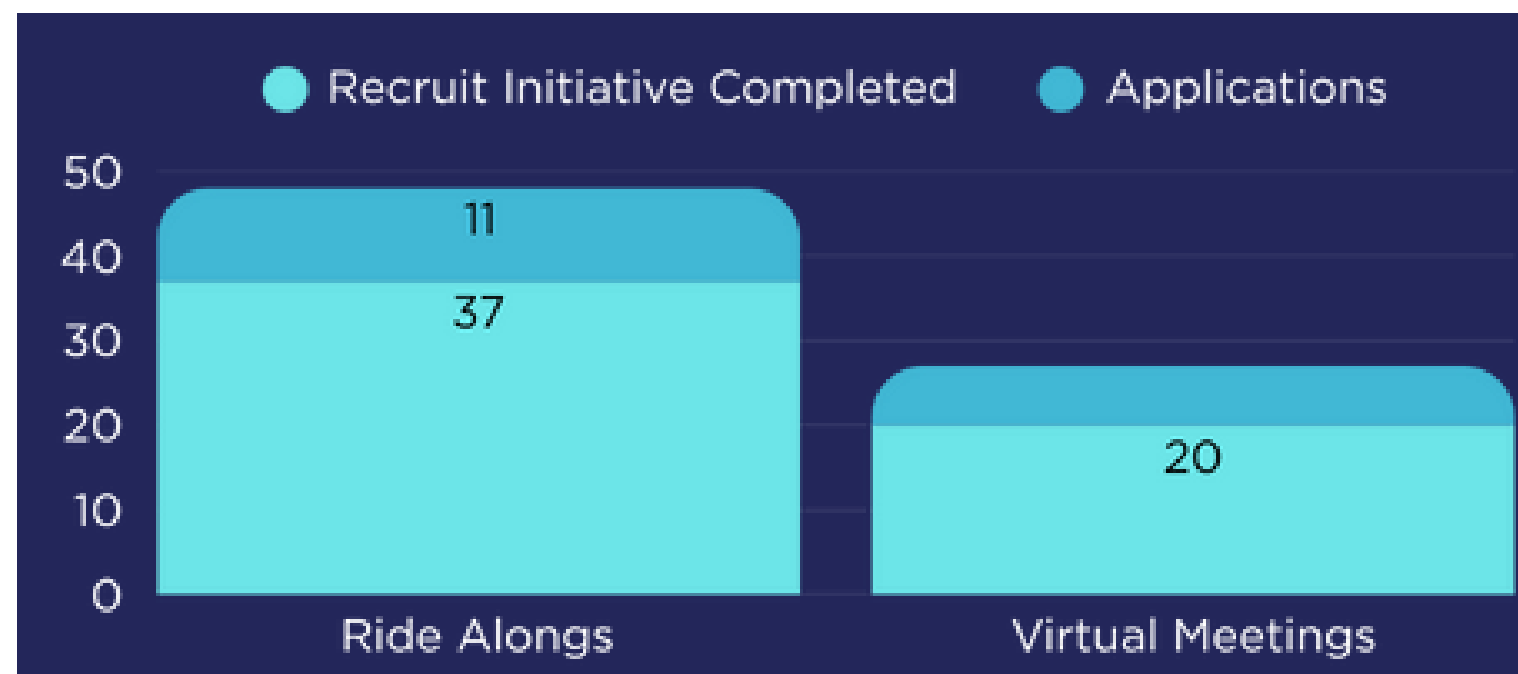
# COLLABORATIVE COMMUNITY SAFETY

- Expanded Auxiliary Officer program to 15
- Achieved a 118% increase in Instagram engagement
- Enhanced technology with digital note taking, in-car video system, next-gen interview recording, and cybersecurity improvements
- Investigated two fatal /two serious -injury collisions
- Expanded youth engagement and education
- Visible presence in high -priority areas
- 75 school presentations



# PROFESSIONAL AND SUPPORTIVE WORKPLACE

- Female sworn officer representation increased to 26%
- Recruitment success: 37 ride-alongs (11 resulting in applications) and 28 participants in the Women in Policing event (10 applications)
- Delivered 7,412 hours of mandated and specialized training
- Wellness initiatives included POST crisis support, SafeGuarding program, therapy dog program, yoga and fitness sessions, and more



# OPERATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS

High demand. High impact.

- Increased victim referrals by 30% through an embedded Victim Support Specialist
- IMPACT (Integrated Mobile Police & Co Response Team) handled 204 live calls, 274 referrals, 35 outreach contacts, and 93 consultations
- Strengthened accountability and transparency through body -worn camera usage and quarterly Board reporting
- Conducted workload reviews to ensure efficient and effective service delivery

The Crime Severity Index (CSI) is an area -based measure of police-reported crime that reflects the relative seriousness of individual offences and tracks changes in crime severity.
